While the Administration asserts it has no plans to close Social Security field offices, a new analysis of workforce data indicates that its policies are eroding community-based services nationwide through significant staff reductions. The Social Security Administration has **lost approximately 7,000 SSA employees over the past year, leaving SSA in a 59-year staffing low.**
